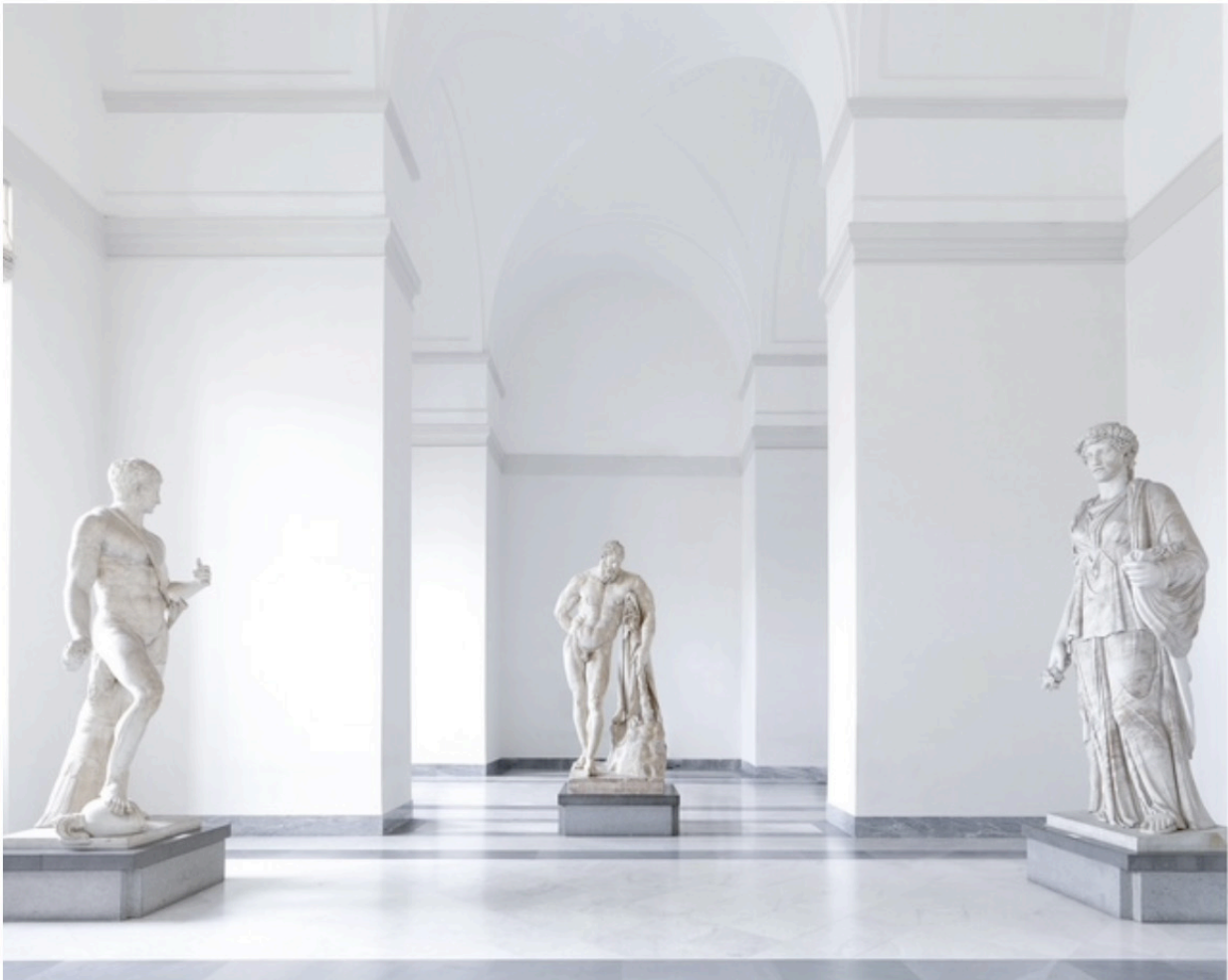
Running until **June 15, 2026**, the exhibition is a key artistic highlight of the prestigious **Salon of Excellence platform**.

**Massimo Listri** is internationally recognized for his photographs that uniquely depict architecture, historic interiors, and cultural heritage, characterized by a flawless sense of perspective, atmospheric quality, and an exceptional use of natural light. Over a career spanning more than three decades, he has published more than **80** monographs for leading global publishers. His works encompass the palaces of **Rome**, the villas of **Tuscany**, **Versailles**, and some of the most significant interiors of **Europe** and the **Americas**.

A particularly significant milestone in his artistic journey is that in **1981**, alongside **Franco Maria Ricci** and **Vittorio Sgarbi**, he co-founded the legendary **FMR magazine**, which for decades was considered one of the world's most influential publications dedicated to art and architecture.

**Massimo Listri's** works have been exhibited in prestigious institutions worldwide, including the **Vatican Museum**, the **Pitti Palace** in **Florence**, the **Kunsthistorisches Museum** in **Vienna**, the **Quirinal Palace** in **Rome**, the **Morgan Library** in **New York**, and numerous other international galleries and museums.

Through the **"Interni Italiani"** exhibition, the **Belgrade** audience will have a unique opportunity to experience architecture and space from the perspective of an artist who has redefined contemporary interior and cultural-heritage photography.
